To the Graduate Applied Research Fellowship Program!

Dates: Spring & Summer 2022 (May - August)

The Applied Research Fellowship program empowers Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander (AANHPI) graduate students to conduct applied research that uplifts prominent issues affecting AANHPI students in higher education and utilize a policy-minded approach to devise recommendations for systemic change.

The Fellowship experience involves:

- Examining data around key issues impacting AANHPI communities
- Working collaboratively with coaches to build professional competencies
- Developing powerful communication tools that educate, elevate, and empower change for our community

Support:

- \$5,000 stipend
- Applied research & policy development workshops
- Coaches in data analytics, policy, and communications

- Connecting with national AANHPI community and advocacy network
