

# THE AANAPISI JOURNEY (2000 - 2009)

**2000**

AAPIs and Educational Need  
The Congressional Asian Pacific American Caucus (CAPAC) hosts a forum to discuss AAPIs and their educational needs, where early public conversations regarding the establishment of an AANHPI Serving Institution were discussed.

**2001**

AAPAPI Higher Education Summit  
SEARAC and CAPAC host a summit on AAPAPI issues in higher education, which included discussions on created a MSI designation for AAPAPI students.

**2001**

WHIAPPI Report  
The White House Initiative on Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders (WHIAAPI) issues a policy report with recommendations for the creation of a federal designation for an AAPAPI Serving Institution.

**2002**

Federal designation  
U.S.Congress member Robert Underwood (D-Guam) introduces H.R. 4825 to create an AAPAPI serving institution designation to be housed in the U.S. Department of Education, along with other MSIs.

**2007-2008**

Congress establishes the AANAPISI program  
The program is 1 of 11 federally designated Minority Serving Institution (MSI) programs, as part of the College Cost Reduction and Access Act. The Higher Education Opportunity Act expands the AANAPISI program.

**2009**

AANAPISIs secure additional funding  
U.S. Congress member Mike Honda (D-CA), as a senior member of the House Appropriations Committee, secures \$2.5 million through the Fiscal-Year 2009 Omnibus Bill to provide additional funding to AANAPISIs.

Findings from the Evaluation of AANAPISIs.

### 2017

AANAPISI Week is established  
Representative Judy Chu (CA - 27) introduces the first Congressional Resolution to observe the 10th anniversary of the AANAPISI designation through an annual "AANAPISI Week."

### 2019

APIA Scholars publishes Exploring the impact of AANAPISI Grant-Funded Programs on Student Experiences and Outcomes  
A Report on UNLV and NHPIs in Higher Education.

APAHE hosts an annual AANAPISI pre-conference meeting.

## 2020

AANAPISI Community Forum (ACF) convenes

APAHE conference is canceled in person, due to COVID; as a result, AANAPISI Community Forum (ACF) forms and hosts first virtual meeting. ACF continues to host monthly virtual convenings on AANAPISI best practices, programmatic information, technical assistance.

APIA Scholars publishes Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders in Higher Education: A Rural Pacific Learning Tour.

AANAPISI Policy Brief

NCAPA and Dr. Mike Hoa Nguyen (University of Denver) publish Strengthening AANAPISIs through Policy and Practice.

## 2021 AND ONWARD

AANAPISI Program Invites New Applications

New federal opportunities are announced for expanding AANAPISI impact on APIA student success.

AANAPISI Research and Capacity Building Initiative

APIA Scholars partners with AANAPISI stakeholders to launch research focusing on past and current AANAPISI grantees.

NHPI initiative

APIA Scholars launches research and capacity building initiative with Dr. Rob Teranishi (UCLA) to engage 8 eligible AANAPISIs in collaborative action research to increase NHPI success outcomes in the Continental U.S., Hawai'i, and U.S. affiliated Pacific Islands.

AANAPISI Community Requests Increased Funding During Federal Budget Reconciliation
