APIA SCHOLARSHIP

The APIA Scholarship is open to all students who will be enrolling or are currently enrolled in a U.S.-accredited college or university as a degree-seeking undergraduate student.

APIA Scholars seeks to provide one-time and many multi-year scholarships to underserved students, with a special focus on students who:

- Are living at or below the poverty level or otherwise demonstrates high financial need
- Are a first-generation college student
- Have shown excellence demonstrated through leadership, academics, and/or personal accomplishments



ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Be a citizen, national, or legal permanent resident of the United States, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, or the Republic of Palau.
- Be enrolling/enrolled as an undergraduate student at a U.S.-accredited institution in the academic year following the application submission. Full-time and part-time degree-seeking students are eligible. Students who have already earned a bachelor's degree or higher are not eligible to apply.
